With over 60% of students from ethnically diverse backgrounds, a fifth of whom are of Black Caribbean heritage, we are actively seeking to promote better representation of the school community, therefore we would particularly encourage parents/carers from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic backgrounds, women, and people with disabilities.

There are usually two meetings a term that are held at the school, normally starting at 7pm. There is the opportunity to sit on sub-committees that focus on specific elements of governance and activity, be involved in interview, pay, exclusion and appeal panels, support senior staff directly; and represent the school at events.

Current sub-committees include:

Resources Committee

This group look in detail at resource and management issues including Finance; Staffing; Pay; Premises and Health & Safety; Documents and Policies; New Legislation.

Learning & Achievement Committee

This group look in detail at the Curriculum; Ofsted Preparation and Monitoring; School Improvement, Outcomes & Progress; School Specialism (Performing Arts).

Inclusion and SEND Committee

This group look in detail at SEN Provision; Alternative Provision; Behaviour; Pastoral Provision.

Governor training is also available

Funded training and support is available for all governors, including specialist training for specific roles and general networking across the borough.

Dear Parents/Carers

ELECTION FOR PARENT GOVERNOR(S)

Following expiry of term of office and a recent resignation, parent-governor elections for 3 parent/carer governors will take place shortly. All governors serve a four year term of office.

Eligibility to stand

All parents/carers and guardians of children at the school are eligible to stand as candidates in the election **EXCEPT**

- if s/he is an elected member of the local education authority; (local councillor)
- if s/he is paid to work at the school for more than 500 hours in any twelve month period beginning on 1 August and finishing on 31 July (an academic year)

Eligibility to vote

Each parent will have **one** vote for **every parent governor vacancy.**

Some people who are not parents but who act as parents/carers and take care of a child at the school may also be able to take part. If you, or someone else living with you, looks after a child in this way, please contact me to check if you will be able to take part in the election.

Information about the role of a parent governor has been included in this pack.

The important dates are:

Friday 03 November 2017

Deadline for submission of completed forms for candidate nominations.

If you want to be a candidate you should return the attached nomination form by the end of the school day on this date (electronically to info@foresthillschool.co.uk or hard copy handed in to Main Reception). You can nominate yourself to stand. If you want to nominate another parent, please check with them first that they are willing to stand and ask them to sign the nomination form in the space provided. Extra copies of the nomination form are available from the school office.

Wednesday 08 November 2017

Voting opens and will take place daily at the school from 8.15am to 4.30pm until voting closes on Friday 24 November. This is to allow as much time as possible for working parents/carers to get to school to vote.

We are investigating the possibility of offering electronic voting. Should this prove a viable option we will notify details when the vote formally opens.

Please note that all new governors are required by law to undergo a check on their suitability to serve. This will be a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check and/or a check against List 99, the DfE list of people whose employment has been barred or restricted either on grounds of misconduct or for medical reasons.

Parent governors are very important to the life of the school and I hope very much that you will vote and also consider being a candidate.
