Newly-unveiled Alan Turing sculpture in Cambridge divides opinion

A sculpture depicting Alan Turing has been unveiled at King's College, Cambridge, where the gay pioneering scientist studied maths in the 1930s.

The statue was designed by Sir Antony Gormley, and is in his signature abstract, blocky style.

The statue has led to much criticism. Some have said that it is not a fitting enough tribute to Turing. Others have said that it captures Turing's "single-minded brilliance".

SOPHIA JEX-BLAKE

(1840 - 1912)

Sophia Jex-Blake (1840 – 1912) was a leading campaigner for allowing women to study medicine, becoming **the first woman in Scotland to become a doctor**.

She faced **rejection** from Harvard University in 1867, and then the University of Edinburgh in 1869, **simply because she was a woman.**



After a second application later in 1869, Sophia and six other women, known as the **Edinburgh Seven**, were granted the right to attend all the classes for a medical degree.

This was not all smooth sailing, however. The Edinburgh Seven received **torrents of abuse**, including having mud, rubbish and insults hurled at them during their medical exams. They were eventually **withdrawn** from the medical course at Edinburgh.

Sophia did not give up. She went on to pass medical exams in Ireland, before returning to Edinburgh as **Scotland's first woman doctor**.


Sophia is widely believed to have been in a **romantic relationship with a fellow female doctor**, Dr Margaret Todd, who wrote an extensive biography of Sophia after her death in 1912.



MICHAEL DILLON (1915 - 1962)

Michael Dillon was the first trans man known to have undergone gender confirmation surgery. While in transition, Dillon wrote the first medical text on trans identity and gender affirming treatments.

After being **outed** in the late 1930s, Dillon relocated his life and wrote *Self:* A Study in Ethics and Endocrinology. The book is thought to be one of the first medical works to discuss trans identity.



In 1943, he was able to change his name to Laurence Michael. Between 1945 and 1949, Dillon underwent a total of **13** surgeries, all the while undertaking his own medical education, attending lectures during term time and undergoing surgery during breaks.

Dillon **qualified as a doctor in 1951**, joining the Merchant Navy as a surgeon, sailing with the navy for six years. However, his Navy days ended abruptly when **tabloid journalists tracked him down, outing him as a trans man**. Dillon's sympathetic shipmates kept unscrupulous reporters at bay whilst Dillon contemplated his next move. He decided to take refuge in India, where he was ultimately drawn to studying Buddhism. He became a Tibetan monk and wrote several books on Buddhism for English audiences. **Sadly, Dillon's health declined, and he died in 1962, aged 47**.



Kevin Fenton (1966 - Present)

Professor Kevin Fenton is a senior **public health expert** and infectious disease epidemiologist.

Fenton was born in Glasgow but **grew up in Jamaica**, where he worked as a government doctor.



Fenton eventually became a senior lecturer and consultant on HIV epidemiology, **carrying out important work on HIV** in both the UK and US in the early 2000s.

Throughout the COVID-19 Pandemic, Fenton wrote two reports about the **health inequalities** faced by minority British people. The review led to recommendations which shaped a more equitable COVID-19 pandemic response. This work was recognised with Fenton ranking second in the 2021 edition of the annual Powerlist of the **most influential Black Britons**.


Fenton was awarded with a CBE in the 2022 New Year Honours for his services to public health.

Asked about his work, Fenton has said "As a gay man and gay leader, I'm always been committed to ensuring we can do the best we can for the communities that are hardest hit".
